OUR MISSION STATEMENT

Vision into Reality: Boldly Planning the Future!

Prayer is powerful. Vision is energizing. Teaming is action. Combining the three enables the church to undergo a spiritual pilgrimage with God into the future.

Consider the elements of prayer, vision, and teaming:

First, strategic prayer intercession. "Strategic" can mean a range of things or nothing at all. It seems to be the latest buzz word to describe every act to make people feel they are working on something important. In this context, however, it is a *key* word. By "strategic prayer intercession," I mean prayer that is informed by the thoughts and desires of the church yet open to the Lord's prompting. Strategic intercession allows the church to pray corporately its journey of faith whether or not people are in the same spot at the same time.

Second, vision. Without a clearly stated and well communicated vision, the church will stand still, stuck in the present or even the past. A vision seeks to identify (1) the local community (body of Christ) – it is a community calling; and (2) specific servant actions of the church – our church is called to focus on *specific strategic actions*.

Third, teaming. A vision must lead to some kind of action to propel the church into the future! Our congregation already has experienced several important action steps of visionary leadership (through the work of the Graceful Growing Together (GGT) team and Council) regarding our proposed building changes to empower mission. Yet turning a vi-



The 2006 Mi Refugio mission team departs for Guatemala on Friday, June 16 and returns on Sunday, June 25. While in Guatemala, our team will do basic medical work, distribute clothing and do Bible games and activities in local villages, as well as teach English and do computer and construction work around the school. In the evenings, we will lead worship and Bible study to grow as followers of Christ.



We sincerely thank the congregation for its tremendous support in donating medical supplies, which will stock a mobile pharmacy. We will continue collecting donations through Sunday, June 11. Please consider donating the following supplies:

- Calcium Supplements
- Gatorade powder
- Anti-nausea medicines
- Worm, Parasite, Scabies, Lice treatments
- Neosporin, Hydrocortisone, Lotrimin/Lamisil and antifungal ointments
- Eye drops for dry/irritated eyes
- Albuteral Inhalers (hand-held)
- Disposable gloves and breathing masks

Summer: A Great Time to Build Family Relationships & Faith!

I love the summer. It's my favorite season of the year. Yes,

it's hot and humid, but it's also the time of year my family gets to spend the most time together. We have always been an on-the-water family, and summer provides us the opportunity to go swimming, fishing, crabbing, kayaking, sailing, tubing and waterskiing. My brothers are home from school and we can all be together. In my opinion, it's the best time of the year.

Indeed, the pace of life seems to slow down for most families during the summer. Thank goodness! After nine months of rushing kids to school, to sports or music lessons, home to do homework, through dinner and bath time and then into bed, summer is a much-needed time for rest and relaxation. That's why the word "vacation" makes us light up.

I encourage families to take full advantage of the slower pace of summer ... to take time normally devoted to homework or other school-year responsibilities to go outside and catch fireflies, or read the *one more* book your child always asks for, or pull out the board games or puzzles for a night of fun. **Playing as a family creates stronger bonds, builds trust, generates happy memories and de-**

velops a genuine enjoyment of each other as individuals. Plus it's just plain fun!

Summer also is a great time to start family devotions if you are not already doing them or to dive deeper into your family's faith if you are. This doesn't have to be a time-consuming thing — in fact, it's better if it isn't! The point is to fill your kids' minds and hearts with the word of God and to help them apply it to their lives. Aim for 10-15 minutes and let God guide what happens in that time — if it's shorter than that, so be it. If you end up talking with your kids for an hour, praise God!

For younger kids, the time may be spent reading a Bible story (from an age-appropriate children's Bible storybook) and talking about the lesson God wants us to learn from it, and then finding teachable moments throughout the day (or week) to apply that lesson to your kids' lives. For teens, follow the same structure only read directly from the Bible so your kids become comfortable interacting with and engaging in God's Word.

My prayer is that this summer you and your family would grow closer to each other and to God. Now *that* would be a great summer!





Council & Mission Endowment Fund

At its regular May 16 meeting, the CELC Council took up several important items of business. First, members elected Steve North as Council President. Other officers are George Wenchel, Vice President; Larry Goolsby, Secretary; and Moges Gebremedhin, Treasurer.

Council then focused on the GGT development and sale agreement with Bozzuto, which should soon be a reality. An important step taken at this meeting was agreement to form three Council teams to more effectively deal with the many major tasks ahead. The teams are (1) the church's purpose and mission; (2) coordination of this mission with the upcoming development process; and (3) the transforming and transitioning process, including our temporary relocation at another site while the development takes place.

A draft of the land sale agreement with Bozzuto is now under final review between Bozzuto officials and CELC leadership and their respective counsel. We expect the sale agreement to be signed by the end of June. Once this is done, Bozzuto will complete its "due diligence" steps, such as environmental assessments. That will follow with an 18- to 20-month series of events including concept and schematic designs, zoning and construction applications, and hopefully related approvals. Once these steps are completed and the sale closes, CELC will then begin the process of vacating the property and moving to a temporary location so construction can safely begin. At this time, we expect the sale to close in the second quarter of 2008, with dates subject to change. The project is being closely coordinated with the three Council teams as well as the Graceful Growing Together (GGT) Steering Committee and outside professional services.

A full briefing and status reports to the congregation will be scheduled for mid July. Mission moments, ongoing Chronicle articles and web site updates also are planned.

Council also discussed plans for the new multi-purpose building that will replace the present education wing. We are calling this new building "The Center" to embrace the many types of space it will house: church, nonprofit, and perhaps even some community-related retail space. Council will finish reviewing these plans over the next month with prayer and careful analysis, and assure that the mix of uses is consistent with our mission and needs. This process was also one of the main topics at the Vision into Reality workshop held May 20 for Council members and other church leaders. Participants thought "outside the box" about the many exciting possibilities The Center could open to us. As part of this visioning process, CELC plans to seek the maximum entitlement space allowed by zoning authorities so that we can take maximum advantage of the mission and revenue opportunity that may be realized by the entire development project.

Council has moved forward on these important initiatives with the input and support of the GGT Steering Committee and the congregation as expressed in several meetings in the last few months, including an information meeting February 26; a town hall meeting March 4; and the annual Congregational Meeting held March 12. At the annual meeting, former Council President Barry Lemley briefed the congregation on the latest development issues. The congregation also approved several important motions, notably the 2006 budget and a plan to allow drawing down the Mission Endowment Fund (MEF) to \$250,000 as necessary to support the church's budget during the upcoming transition period. Council also agreed to review suggestions made by the congregation on ways to rebuild the MEF, and a joint Council-MEF task force will examine alternatives in detail.

At the March 12 meeting, the congregation also approved three-year terms for four Council members: Greg Beyer, Jeff Leach, Rhea McVicker, and Maura Miller. The congregation also was advised that as part of the development process, two positions will be funded – a Development Coordinator and Owners' Representative. These will be filled by Michael T. Foster Associates (continuing their past role with us) and Barry Lemley, respectively.
