Is There Salt in Your Shaker?

God has created us, equipped us, molded us, and energized us to be like salt — common but valuable, simple but with more than 14,000 uses.

Salt in one form or another is part of our daily lives by necessity and has been for thousands of years. In fact, the quest for and consumption of salt is actually more like a human obsession.

Jesus attempts to put it in perspective with this curious slant on salt: "Salt is good," he says in Luke 14:34. It's a common mineral that makes everything taste better, last longer. In Matthew's version, Jesus calls his disciples "salt of the earth," common but extremely valuable. The twist comes with the next qualifier: "But if salt has lost its taste, how can saltiness be restored?" Say what? After all, we know that the salt on our table keeps its flavor no matter what, so how is it possible for covenant—sealed "salty" disciples to lose their flavor and usefulness? In fact, Jesus implies that unsalted disciples are of no use — not fit for the soil or even for the manure pile, where some types of salt were used to preserve animal droppings for field fertilization.

Development Update

At the July meeting, the Church Council accepted the recommendation from the GGT Steering Committee and the Council development team and unanimously passed a motion to move forward on the development of the multi-purpose building and sanctuary renovations.

On the Land Sale, thanks to great work by Ray Albright, our office staff, attorneys and MTFA, as well as Bozzuto, the Feasibility Period was completed on schedule on August 14th and the first escrow check of \$100,000 was wired to CELC.

The GGT Team will have a booth at the Fall Festival on September 10 with more details.

Mi Refugio Mission Trip a Success!

We were all part of the mission trip to Mi Refugio in Guatemala. Whether you supported the mission through donations and prayers or you were one of us who flew into Guatemala City, your part in the trip was very much appreciated.

When we were packing for the trip, I was impressed by the sheer volume of medical supplies directly donated or purchased from monetary donations. We could each fill a suitcase with the supplies. Hundreds of villagers and those who lived near the city dump were able to have basic medical needs met that week.

Our supplies and care were received with gratitude. The school kids at Mi Refugio and the local villagers were amazing with their positive and humble attitude. I did

not hear complaining or whining even though most of them did not have many (or any) toys and limited clothes.

What they did have was color. The traditional clothing was colorful and showed the Mayan in-



fluence with bright reds, oranges, and blues. Many fields were filled with flowers, which is one of the country's chief exports. Jill and I met a local, Juan, during one lunch who explained that Guatemala is also known as the country of eternal spring because of the

climate and the constant green of the vegetation.

In many ways we benefited as much from the experience as those we were sent to help.





Is There Salt in Your Shaker?

Imagine being valued less than fertilizer — talk about not being worth your salt! What could a follower of Jesus do that's so heinous that you don't even qualify for the dung heap?

A short chemistry lesson may help us here. Modern table salt doesn't



ever lose its "saltiness" because impurities are removed and chemicals like anti-caking agents are added. Salt in Jesus' day was

somewhat less reliable. Dr. Robert Shephard, retired professor of chemistry at Northeastern, offers this possible explanation:

"Most, if not all, commercially available salt in biblical times was produced by evaporation of either sea water or brine from salt wells or salt lakes, such as the Dead Sea. All of these sources contain other salts besides sodium chloride, notably calcium salts. When the brine is evaporated, these calcium salts combine with dissolved carbon dioxide and leave behind calcium carbonate, chalk. On standing for long periods exposed to moist air, the soluble sodium chloride will absorb water and leach away, leaving mostly chalk."

In other words, salt that was simply left lying around unused and exposed would eventually lose its taste, leaving behind something that's great for blackboards and ball fields but useless in your salad.

Jesus drives the point home: Disciples are only valuable, worth their salt, if they are used!

Now, being "used" is usually a bad thing for most people — something we can't seem to get "used" to. We'd rather not be taken advantage of, walked on, dumped on, or otherwise be "used" by someone

else. But in fact, that's a big chunk of the overhead cost of being a disciple of Jesus. He went to the cross for people who used him for their own purposes — political, personal or otherwise. But because he was used, everything tastes different — the bitterness of sin and death turned into the salty—sweet flavor of eternal life.

In any case, to follow Jesus is to be used — to pick up a cross, to give up claim on our own lives, to be put in situations we'd often rather not get into. It's a recognition that when we pray, "Lord, use me," it's a guarantee that he will and in a way that may cost us everything. But the good news is this: The more we are used, the more valuable we become and the closer we are to realizing the incredible purpose and fullness of life to which we are called.

Where is Jesus wanting to use you? Who are the people, the needy, the desperate, the hurting around you who could use you — your time, your talent, your treasure — right now?

The alternative is that we sit tight, clump together, and individually and collectively go bad — absorbed and dispersed into a world that seems headed for the manure pile.

God has created us, equipped us, molded us, energized us, and purposed us for divine use — to be his instruments for changing the world. We are all "the salt of the earth" — common but valuable, simple but with more than 14,000 uses.

When Jesus calls us to follow him, reaching for you there on the table — or in your home, at your place of work, in your church, or even someplace you've never imagined — will there be real, tasty salt in your shaker?

What are disciples up to at CELC? Disciples at CELC are **inviting** people to faith, **equipping** people to be fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ, and **servicing** Christ by reaching out to those who are afflicted, and hurting in a suffering world.
