

Going Forward

"Jeremiah said, 'The word of the LORD came to me: I knew that this was the word of the LORD; so I bought the field at Anathoth from my cousin Hanamel and weighed out for him seventeen shekels of silver. I signed and sealed the deed, had it witnessed, and weighed out the silver on the scales.'" (Jeremiah 32:6, 8-10)

Jeremiah is commanded by God to buy land with siege ramps already under construction at the walls of Jerusalem and the national economy in turmoil. It also would seem likely that cousin Hanamel was looking to sell out and flee before the approaching Babylonian armies overran the area and simply took the land from him. It was a perilous and unstable time. Many would see the siege of Jerusalem as a red light in the way of any land purchase.

While Jeremiah's motives may be unclear, it's obvious that in those uncertain days it was hardly a favorable time for investing in Judean land. These lands were on the verge of being considered spoils-of-war, taken by force and given over to new settlers, while the native families either were killed or exiled beyond the borders of Judah.

Hanamel arrives at court with this great deal for his cousin. A break in the Babylonian siege of the city in the summer of 588 BCE allowed him to gain access to Jeremiah. Obviously, Jeremiah saw this fortuitous timing itself as part of God's planned word for his prophet to keep going forward.

So what are we supposed to do when life gives us a red light? The red light in our life may be a time of financial uncertainty, a relationship break-up, family trouble, marriage difficulties and health prob-

Daycare Update

At a special August board meeting, the Christ Church Children’s Center (CCCC) Board of Directors agreed in principle to allow the church to approve a majority of the center’s board.

The daycare will remain a separate corporation and continue meeting in its current space at the church. Lease extension conversations are now in progress.

The vote came after months of discussion between representatives of the church and the daycare on how the two could work together to provide quality Christian childcare to the community. The daycare previ-

ously had agreed it would be accountable to the church’s mission and had agreed in principle to a sample Christian curriculum.

The new seven-member board will have four church-approved and three non-church approved members. The new board members, who will be formally approved by the CCCC board this November,

include Laurie Heinecke, Maura Miller, Gene Saylor and Karen Spinner. They have agreed to serve, have been approved by the church council and will be seated with the new board in January 2005. The three non-CLC approved members are Will Jacobi, Rhonda Dever and Gardell Gefke. Many thanks to everyone who sup-

Development Update

Many thanks to more than a dozen people who attended the Sept. 18th town hall meeting on development issues. The 90-minute session, led by the Graceful Growing Together (GGT)

Steering Committee, covered a status update and “next steps” leading up to the Nov. 14th congregational meeting and vote. There was good discussion and many questions were answered.

In response to last month’s Request for Proposal (RFP), released on the church’s behalf by consultant MTFa, the church received credible proposals from four developers. The GGT Steering Committee will conduct screening interviews in late September and early October using the following broad criteria: (1) Overall approach to the project; (2) Relationship to market and municipality; (3) Estimated timelines; (4)

Effectiveness of developing a concept plan; and (5) Range of expectations of value.

Results of this process and other details will be shared with the council and congregation in the weeks leading up to the Nov. 14 congregational meeting and vote.

Using Our "Growing Edge" to be a Blessing

The youth and family ministry team met in September for an exciting time of visioning and planning. A devotional challenged us to consider how we can use our "growing edge" — the opportunities and resources God has given us at this time and in this place — to be a blessing to the world. We were challenged to go beyond our already established ministries to think in "big picture" ways.

How can we use our "growing edge" to be a blessing to the world?

We focused mainly on two opportunities. The first is **outreach to families in the daycare** so we can begin breaking down barriers and building healthy relationships. We believe it's important for friendly faces to come to mind when daycare families think of the church. To this end, we are working on ways we can spend time with daycare families in comfortable and non-threatening environments.

The second involves **preparing the new Glenbrook Road house for use** by the youth for Third Degree, youth group meetings and other events, as well as for use by other small groups. We are very excited by the opportunities the house provides to reach out to people who may not feel comfortable coming to a traditional church building. The first step is getting approval from the fire marshal to use the facility. After that, we will need lots of help to get the house into shape!
